The necessity of authoritative data

Conclusions of Survey Data

- 1. Most organizations have a formalised approach and obligation to use authoritative data.
- 2. A strong variety in applied definitions and approaches.
- 3. Different opinions on which data to consider as authoritative.
- 4. Consensus on central role of public organizations in the organization and use of authoritative data.



Conclusions on Focus Groups

- 1. Additional conditions and characteristics added
- 2. Need for resources to ensure data quality and up-todateness
- 3. Easy accessible to stimulate reuse for both public and private sector organizations.
- 4. Need for public sector organizations to take up a central role in the governance of authoritative data.



Key Recommendations

- Inter-organizational, cross-sector and cross-border exchange of authoritative data necessitates the need for transparency about the characteristics of the authoritative data
- 2. A harmonization of definitions and criteria is necessary at
 - Country level
 - European level
 - → Use of network and hierarchy related instruments



Key Recommendations

- 3. Necessary that the role of public organizations is evaluated → develop dataset classification scheme
 - Core authoritative datasets whereby authoritative public organizations are in charge
 - Datasets governed in cooperation between public organizations / private sector and authoritative public organizations
 - Other datasets governed by other public organizations or the private sector → authoritative public organizations in side role
