Data harmonisation: a key topic for INSPIRE KEN

- Data interoperability is one of the INSPIRE components
 - Implementing Rules adopted
 - in 2010 (annex I)
 - in 2013 (annexes II and III)
 - Dead-line for implementation
 - 2017 for annex I themes
 - 2020 for annexes II and III themes
- INSPIRE KEN was launched in 2011
 - Most requirements on existing data already implemented by NMCAs
 - Strong focus on interoperability implementation!

Core data

- Defining priorities for production of new data or enhancement of existing one
- Common minimum content in Europe
- Selected Core themes: most are under NMCAs responsibility
- Recommendations for content based on user requirements (focus on SDG) and on INSPIRE data specifications
- Complementing INSPIRE





Some learnings

Users and use cases will come when a critical mass of data is available (2013)

Critical mass of data is there for annex I (even if not perfect).

Most of transformation work has been done

Users and use cases are coming slowly. Interest for standardised data.

Potential users not always aware of INSPIRE data.

INSPIRE data suppliers not always aware of potential users.

Some learnings

Real benefit will come in long term with annex III data data available and interoperable => more applications => more use of annexes I and II data (2013)

Annex III data far from being interoperable.
