We are pleased to announce that the Danish Geodata Agency will assume the Presidency of the Permanent Committee on Cadastre in the European Union (PCC) as of 1 July 2025. In this regard, the Danish Geodata Agency will host the Joint PCC and EuroGeographics CLRKEN Conference and Plenary Meeting, which will take place in Aalborg, Denmark, from 3–5 November 2025. The conference is arranged in co-operation with CLRKEN, EuroGeographics.

The conference will commence with an icebreaker event on the evening of 3 November, followed by the main conference on 4 and 5 November 2025. The icebreaker will be held at the office of the Danish Geodata Agency.

The venue for the conference will be the Radisson Blu Limfjord Hotel, located in the heart of Aalborg. A limited number of rooms have been reserved for participants at a discounted rate. We encourage you to make your booking before 1 September 2025 to benefit from this offer. Please note that the Danish Geodata Agency cannot guarantee room availability after this date.

The main topic of the conference is: **“Property data and climate adaptation – The cadastre’s role in addressing climate challenges”**.
