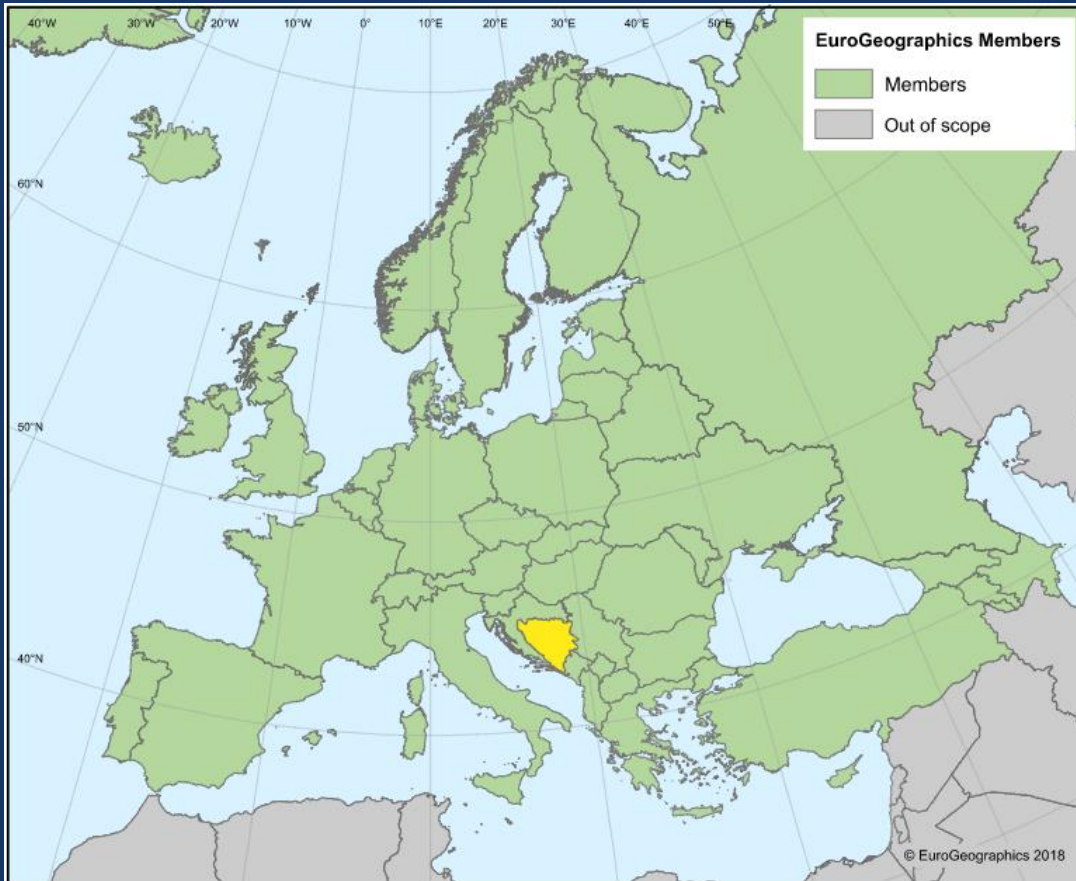

Location: *Southeast Europe.*

Area: *51,129 km²*

Population: *3.8 million inhabitants.*

#1 The country is nicknamed the “Heart Shaped Land” due to the country’s slight heart shape.

#2 The name part „Bosnia” comes from an Indo-European word Bosana, which means water, and the name part „Herzegovina” - herzog's land, originates from German word for "duke" given by Stjepan Vukčić Kosača's title „Herceg of Hum and the Coast“.

#3 Bosnia and Herzegovina is said to have been inhabited since the New Stone Age.



#4 Stećak is a medieval tombstone that can be seen dispersed all over the rural areas of Bosnia and Herzegovina. There are three sites in Bosnia and Herzegovina on the UNESCO list as of 2018.



#5 Stari Most (Old Bride) in Mostar is one of the country's most identifiable landmarks. It is a 16th-century Ottoman bridge that stood for more than 427 years. The bridge was reconstructed and opened in 2004 and is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



#6 Much of the landscape in Bosnia and Herzegovina is mountainous. Maglić is the highest peak at an elevation of 2,386 meters.

262 smaller or larger rivers are recorded in Bosnia and Herzegovina, thus it can be rightly said that our country is the land of rivers.

#7 Bosnia and Herzegovina has the last remaining jungle in Europe at Perućica. The Perućica forest is not massive but it has many trees that are more than 300 years old and in many parts is inaccessible to humans due to the density of the flora and fauna.



#8 Bosnia and Herzegovina has the tenth highest coffee consumption per capita in the world.



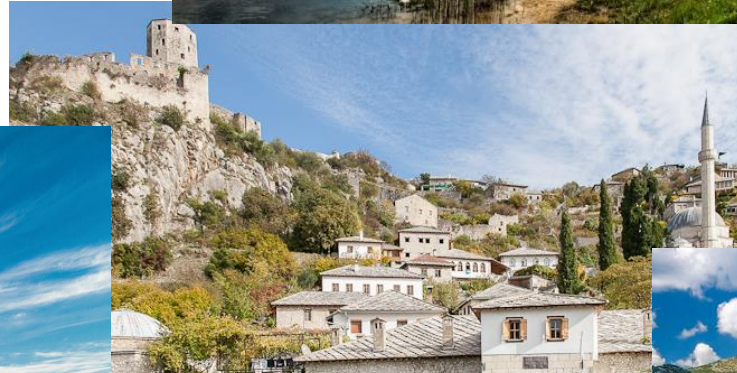
#9 Ivo Andrić (Literature, 1961) and Vladimir Prelog (Chemistry, 1975) from Bosnia and Herzegovina - Nobel Prize winners.

Danis Tanović from Bosnia and Herzegovina won the Oscar award for the best foreign film „No Man’s Land”.



#10 According to projections by the World Tourism Organization, Bosnia and Herzegovina will have the third highest tourism growth rate in the world between 1995 and 2020.

In 2018, 1.883.772 tourists visited Bosnia-Herzegovina, an increase of 44,1%, and had 3.843.484 overnight hotel stays, a 43.5% increase from the previous year. Also, 71.2% of the tourists came from foreign countries.



#1 Lonely Planet named Sarajevo as the 43rd best city in the world;

In 2010, Lonely Planet's "Best In Travel" nominated Sarajevo as one of the top ten cities to visit.

#2 Sarajevo, the capital city of Bosnia and Herzegovina, hosted the 1984 Winter Olympics.



#3 Trams were first regularly used in Europe in Sarajevo, starting in 1885.



#4 The Sarajevo Sahat Tower is a historic timepiece which is said to be the only clock in the world that keeps lunar time.

#5 Established in 1995, Sarajevo Film Festival has become the largest and most famous film festival in the Balkans and South-East Europe.





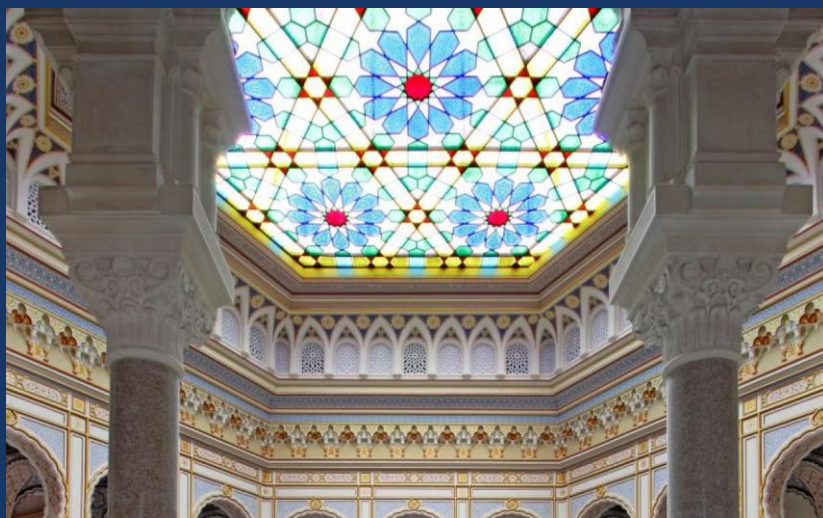
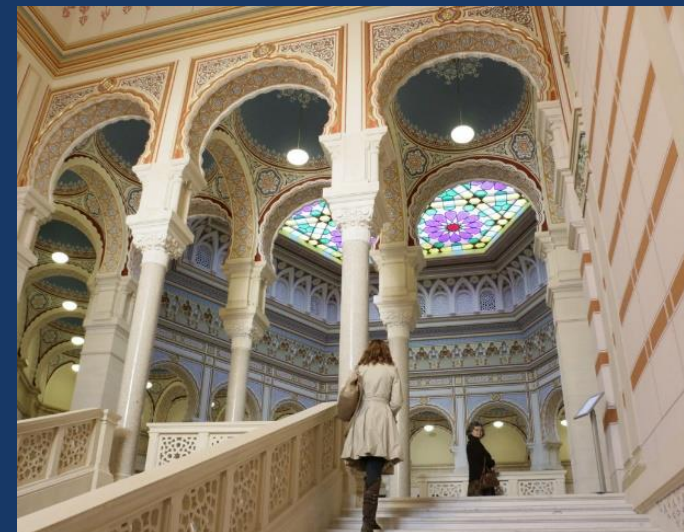
Hotel Holiday Sarajevo

- Hotel opened for the XIV Winter Olympic Games in Sarajevo in 1984.
