and national government parties



Common operational picture


Collect once – use multiple times

# Tender 4: two pilots

- Municipal cooperations buy their own imagery and supply it to the Tender 4 project.
- Other municipalities stop their own collection and participate in Tender 4.



# Tender 4

More possibilities with new technologies

Main differences with Tender 3:

- More partners!
- 9 parcels with smaller blocks to speed up delivery
- More groundpoints for first-time-right processing
- Stimulating early-flying

# Project approach

Preparation phase: consultation with suppliers and participants about possible and required specifications

Tender phase: European tender

Realisation phase: execution of Tender 4.

High Resolution:  
4, 5, 7,5 and 10 cm - 60/30 overlap


Low Resolution:  
25 cm - 80/20 overlap
