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# Statistic framework regulation proposal

Background – reasons for and the objectives:

- Social fairness for all citizens
- Social goals must be supported by a solid evidence base
- EU needs **reliable and timely** social statistics to monitor and to impact in the MS and their regions
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- Good policies start with good data





## Background – reasons for and the objectives:

1. ESS produces statistical data:
2. taken from variety of sources: population census, aggregated admin data, data from business, & data and persons collected from samples - the proposal is related to this source since the current system is made up of separate domain specific Regulations, i.e. 5 legal basis
2. REFIT programme initiated integration process
3. REGULATION proposal is outcome, it lays down the same law throughout EU unlike directive





# State of play

- On the 24<sup>th</sup> August the Commission adopted the proposal text;
- That is the start of proposal's passage through the legislative process;
- expected to be adopted by the Parliament and the Council in 2017 or 2018;
- adoption of implementing measures by the Commission to follow shortly afterwards;
- Upon entering into force, the Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.





# About regulation

- sets up a framework for European statistics relating to **persons and households** based on data at individual level collected from samples
- **specifies** the data and information to be collected and submitted by MS
- and includes the fundamental **quality requirements** to be met by the data
- provides for more detailed technical specifications to be given in **delegated acts and implementing measures**
- allows the various data collections to be **integrated** with one another and with the use of administrative data, while consolidating and simplifying existing legislation
